9. **Can Man Pervert God’s Word By Rewriting It?** It is fact that many modern versions of the Bible are not translations, rather man’s paraphrases. These “versions” contain perversions. You can find about any kind of doctrine you want. Any version becomes a man-made document when it fails in the truest possible word-for-word translation. One example: (Ps 51:5 – NIV) “Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.” Were you sinful from the time you were conceived? _____ The NIV teaches inherited sin, a Calvinistic doctrine. Jesus said: (Mt 19:14) “Suffer little children, and forbid them not, to come unto me: for of such is the kingdom of heaven.” (Prov 30:6) “Add thou _____ unto his words, lest he _____ thee, and thou be found a _____.” Space and format prohibits a treatise on spurious versions. I have no bone to pick with any particular version. The increasing desire for an *easy-to-understand Bible* speaks volumes about our *instant gratification* age. Many unwittingly swallow anything hook-line-and-sinker if the requirement levels are low. ~Ed~
10. **Does The Bible Contradict Itself?** If it does it is not from God. If so, it is surely because man has perverted one or more parts. We may *think* something unharmonious when it isn’t. We may simply fail to understand. Parts of the Bible are harder to understand. We can’t tear out parts we wish to disavow while treating the rest as verbally inspired. How can it be inerrant if it isn’t from God?
11. **Jesus Said “the scripture cannot be broken” – (Jn 10:35b)** Jesus had said he was the Son of God. He was defending himself against stoning. He referred to (Ps 82:6) and makes the argument that the OT (the written scriptures which these Jews accepted) referred to those who executed God’s law as “gods”. It is incongruous to think *the scripture can be broken* in one place but not in another. *Consistency thou art a jewel!* (2 Peter 1:20) “No prophecy of the scripture is of any _____.” This means the _____ inspired every writer. It means the writers were not allowed their _____ interpretation of what to say or write. That is hardly the case with writers of many new versions in our age of mass publication and high-dollar marketing.
