It is a word that clearly means necessity. (c) Note the singular pronoun “*I*.” This shows individual responsibility. It is not a matter of what God, or even some other historical person may do. (d) What about the little transitive verb “*do*?” Never do we read in the Bible where a sinner is told to be completely passive. This word suggests activity. (e) Close examination of the phrase “*to be saved*” tells us the purpose of complying with the conditions. This is what the student is seeking. 8. **The Rich Young Ruler** This man asked Jesus (Mk 10:17), “*Good Master, _____ that I may inherit eternal life?*” Jesus answered him according to the Mosaic Law which they both lived under at the time. The answer was simple: “*Go thy way, _____ whatsoever thou hast, and _____, and thou shalt have _____ in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and _____.*” This man was already a Jew. He only needed to be a conscientious practitioner of the law under which he lived. Did he like the answer? ____

The Lord appeared to him on the road to Damascus and Saul asked (Acts 9), “*Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?*” Verse? ____ Saul, already extremely religious, knew he needed information so make changes. The Lord told him where to go to get that information. Saul went! Ananias told him (Acts 22:16), “*And now why _____ thou? arise, and _____, and _____, calling on the name of the Lord.*”
11. **The Third Incidence** Saul, who became known by the Greek name Paul after his conversion, was in jail in Phillipi (Acts 16). An earthquake freed the prisoners. The jailer was about to take his own life as he was certain his prisoners had escaped.
