A: The time wasn’t right yet! Later, on the transfiguration mount (Mt 17:9), he said: “Tell the vision _____, until the Son of man be _____ again from the _____.” This gives us a time-line! Even after his resurrection, Jesus instructed (Lk 24:49), “But _____ in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be _____ with _____ from on high.” Not until Pentecost Day was he to be proclaimed as Savior in the first gospel sermon.
8. **The “Gates Of Hell” – Mt 16:18** “Upon this rock I will _____ my _____; and the _____ shall not prevail against it.” The prophecy (Isa 28:14-18) was, in part, that “Behold, I lay in _____ for a foundation _____, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation.” This is the “rock” of (Mt 16:18) and (1 Cor 10:4): “that Rock was _____.” Note the (Isa 28) prophecy again: “And your _____ with _____ shall be disannulled, and your _____ with _____ shall not stand.” “Hell” in these scriptures means world of the departed dead. Jesus would not remain there. (Mk 16:6) “He is _____; he is not _____.”
9. **The Sure Foundation** God said (Isa 28): “I lay in Zion for a _____ a stone---a sure foundation.” Jesus said (Mt 16:18): “Upon this _____ I will _____ my _____.” Note (1 Cor 3:11): “For other _____ can no man lay than that _____, which is _____ Christ.” The church wasn’t built on Peter (Petros) but on the rock (petras) which was Christ.
10. **The Holy Spirit’s Gospel Mission Began On Pentecost Day** (Jn 16:7-8) Jesus promised the “Comforter” and said “but if I _____, I will _____ unto you.” He said, “He will _____ the world of _____, and of _____, and of _____.” This was done through the apostles but not until Pentecost Day.
11. **The Holy Spirit Would Come After Jesus Was Glorified** (Jn 7:38-39) records that “the Holy Ghost was _____; because that Jesus was _____ glorified.” In (Lk 24) two disciples, one named _____ (V18), were unbeknownst joined by the resurrected Jesus. He said to them (V26): “Ought not _____ to have _____ these things, and to _____ his _____?” Jesus wasn’t “glorified” until he ascended to heaven (See: Acts 1:9-11). He was in heaven at God’s right hand on the Day of Pentecost when the first gospel sermon was preached.
12. **Facts Preached For The First Time** The Apostle (1 Cor 15:1-4) in the great resurrection chapter of the Bible (1 Cor 15) said, “I declare unto you the _____...by which also ye are _____.” He names the facts: “How that Christ _____ for our sins---was _____” and “_____ the third day according to the _____.” This was first preached on Pentecost Day.
13. **Christ’s Law Of Pardon First Given On Pentecost** Note the words of Jesus (Lk 24:46-47): “Thus it is _____, and thus it behoved Christ to _____, and to _____ the third day: And that _____ and _____ should be preached in _____ among _____, beginning at _____.” From Pentecost onward it would no longer be “unto” or “preparatory to” the “kingdom” which had been “at hand.” It all became reality on Pentecost Day.
14. **The Audience** They were Jews. Paul said (Rom 1:16) that he wasn’t “ashamed of the _____ of Christ,” that “it is the _____ unto salvation” to “the _____, and also to the Greek.” A decade would pass before the Gentiles would become recipients.
15. **Their Origin** (Acts 2:9-11) How many different locales are mentioned? _____ What question did they ask (V8) when the apostles, now endowed with the Holy Spirit, began to speak in tongues?
16. **Intelligible Tongues?** They said: “We do hear them speak in _____ the wonderful _____ of _____.” Scripture? _____ In whose tongues? _____ Was this a “miracle of tongues” or a “miracle of ears”? _____ Why were the apostles empowered to preach this first gospel sermon in these numerous intelligible tongues? _____
