

It seems likely that thunder and lightning preceded Jesus appearing to Saul, similar to what happened when God spoke to Elijah, and that this was what the men heard and saw. If not, it was light and noise different from what Saul experienced, which still amounts to supernatural circumstances. They (22:9) “*saw \_\_\_\_\_ the light*” and Luke records them as (9:7) “*hearing a \_\_\_\_\_.*” What they heard and saw wasn’t Jesus, or his voice.

8. **Saul’s Conversation With Jesus** (9:6) It was succinct and to the point. Saul: “*Lord, \_\_\_\_\_ wilt thou have me \_\_\_\_\_?*” Jesus: “*Arise, and \_\_\_\_\_, and it \_\_\_\_\_ told thee what thou must do.*” Jesus only told the persecutor Saul where to go to learn what he must do to be saved. He didn’t tell him what to do. Can you find any other evidence in the NT that indicates this account is not factual? \_\_\_\_ If not, why do so many people want to believe that Saul was saved on the Damascus Road before he even knew what to do to be saved?
9. **The Last Leg Of The Trip** (V8) “*And Saul \_\_\_\_\_ from the earth; and when his eyes were opened, \_\_\_\_\_: but they \_\_\_\_\_ by the hand, and brought him \_\_\_\_\_ Damascus.*” Saul was blind because Ananias later told him (22:13) “*\_\_\_\_\_ thy sight.*” Keep in mind that Saul’s mission to Damascus has now changed. Instead of going to arrest Christians he is now humbly going to seek spiritual guidance to become a Christian.
10. **Saul In Damascus** Saul was brought to (9:11) “*the house of \_\_\_\_\_*” located on “*the \_\_\_\_\_ which is called \_\_\_\_\_*” and (V9) “*was \_\_\_\_\_ days without \_\_\_\_\_, and neither did \_\_\_\_\_ nor \_\_\_\_\_.*” The Lord instructed Ananias to go to Saul and informed him that Saul (V11) “*prayeth*” and had “*seen in a \_\_\_\_\_ a man named Ananias coming in, and putting \_\_\_\_\_ on him, that he might \_\_\_\_\_ his \_\_\_\_\_.*”
11. **What Happened When Ananias Arrived?** Ananias (V17) “*entered into the house; and putting his \_\_\_\_\_ on him*” told him that “*Jesus----hath \_\_\_\_\_, that thou mightest receive thy sight.*” What happened? (V18) “*And \_\_\_\_\_ there fell from his eyes as it had been scales: and he \_\_\_\_\_ forthwith, and arose, and was \_\_\_\_\_.*”
12. **Paul Fills In The Details – Acts 22** Years later in his speech on the castle stairs Paul relates what happened to him on the Damascus Road, and subsequently in Damascus. After telling of Jesus appearing to him, he said (22:10) that “*the Lord said unto me, \_\_\_\_\_, and go into \_\_\_\_\_; and there it shall be \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ which are appointed \_\_\_\_\_.*” Paul related how Ananias told him that God wanted to use him (V14-15) to “*know his \_\_\_\_\_*” and “*be his \_\_\_\_\_ unto \_\_\_\_\_ of what thou hast \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_.*” What a wonderful “witness” Saul the persecutor became after his conversion.
13. **In Paul’s Own Words** Paul said that Ananias restored his sight and related everything that Jesus wanted him to know. Then Paul said (V16) that Ananias told him, “*And now why \_\_\_\_\_ thou? arise, and \_\_\_\_\_, and \_\_\_\_\_ thy \_\_\_\_\_, calling on the name of the Lord.*” (a) Saul, a very religious man, unsaved because he still remained in sin. (b) His sins were “washed away” only when he was baptized. This happened in Damascus, not on the road from Jerusalem to Damascus. These are Paul’s own words. He knew what happened. We must believe his words!
